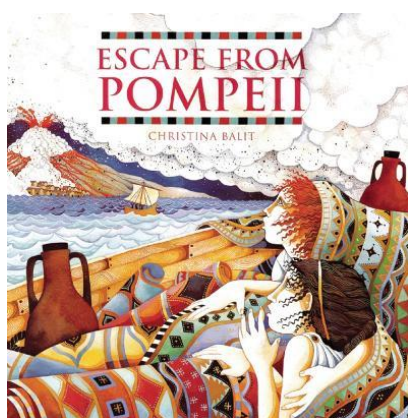
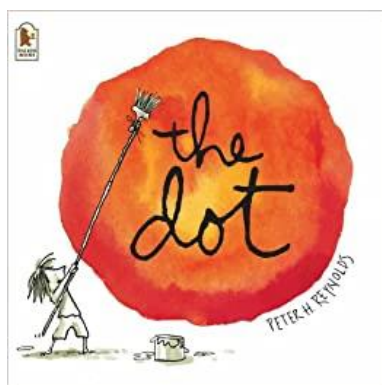

'The Dot' by Peter H Reynolds

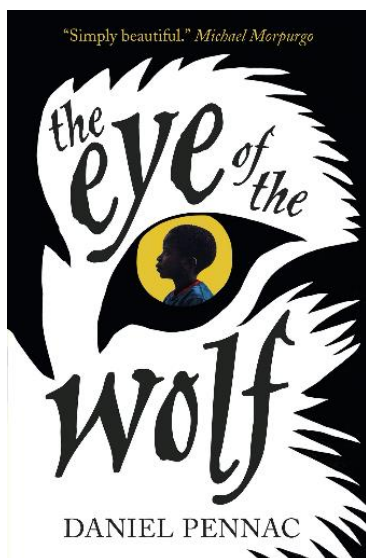
